# ENG 101 and 102

- Any student who is likely to attend Del Tech or UD may want to consider taking DTCC ENG 101 & 102 if it is offered at their home school through Dual Enrollment **during Senior year**
- Every degree program at Delaware Tech requires ENG 101 & 102 during Freshman year. All students attending Del Tech in every program have an advantage by taking ENG 101 & 102 before enrolling full time.
- In Spring 2024, UD announced that DTCC ENG 101 and 102, taken through Delaware Tech as Dual Enrollment, will be accepted at UD; students who pass both courses will be provided an exemption from taking UD's English 110 course and granted 3 credits for an English department elective.
  - The 6-7 credits students earn for Level 5 AC English classes will transfer to UD but will not provide an exemption from taking UD's English 110.
- AC students could:
  - Enroll in the Dual Enrollment ENG 101 & 102 courses at the home school and continue with AC Level 5 English
  - Drop AC after Level 4 and enroll in Dual Enrollment ENG 101 & 102
  - Continue in AC without taking Dual Enrollment ENG 101 & 102

# Registration

- You need your DTCC ID number to register, which can be found at the Student Information System page under “Student Profile”
- Registration is on a first come, first served basis
- **Register early to get the sections you want**
- If you need to change your registration, return to the form and select your new course choices
- Consult with your friends to arrange transportation

## Spring 2027 Registration

In October 2026, the AC Office will send an email with Registration information for Spring 2027 courses:

Math: Calc II *or* Finite Math

English: Intro to the Legal System *or* Human Development *or* Political Science *or* Ethical Issues in Healthcare *or* Interpersonal Communications & Relations

# FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) FORM

- FERPA protects the privacy of student education records
- This right to privacy means parents can have no communication with the College, unless their student signs a FERPA form
- In MyDTCC, go to the Student Information System page and under Student Forms, fill out the Release of Non-Directory Information (FERPA Form) naming your parent(s) or guardian(s) on the form
- DTCC instructors will not directly contact parents; Communication will be conducted through the AC coordinator

## Add your SSN to the DTCC system

- The college uses Parchment for transcripts which connects you to your transcript at Del Tech through your social security number; delays can occur when you order your transcript to send to your college at the end of Level 5 if Del Tech does not have your SSN
- The AC office is not allowed to collect SSNs when students register in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, so you have to voluntarily add it to the system
- While at the Student Information System page, go to the Change of Personal Data form and add your Social Security Number, submitting a photo of your number

# Books, Transportation & Tutoring

- For all Level 4 & 5 courses, Books are delivered to classroom on the first day and all books must be returned at the end of the semester except the Calculus textbook.
- At Level 4 & 5, students must arrange transportation to and from classes at DTCC. Coordinate with classmates! Help each other out!
- All AC students may use the DTCC Math Center and Writing Center for support with their DTCC college classes. Support is available both in-person in the Stephen J. Betze Library and at the [Virtual Support Center](#). Ask your instructor or contact the AC office any time you need information about course support. The Del Tech team is committed to your success!

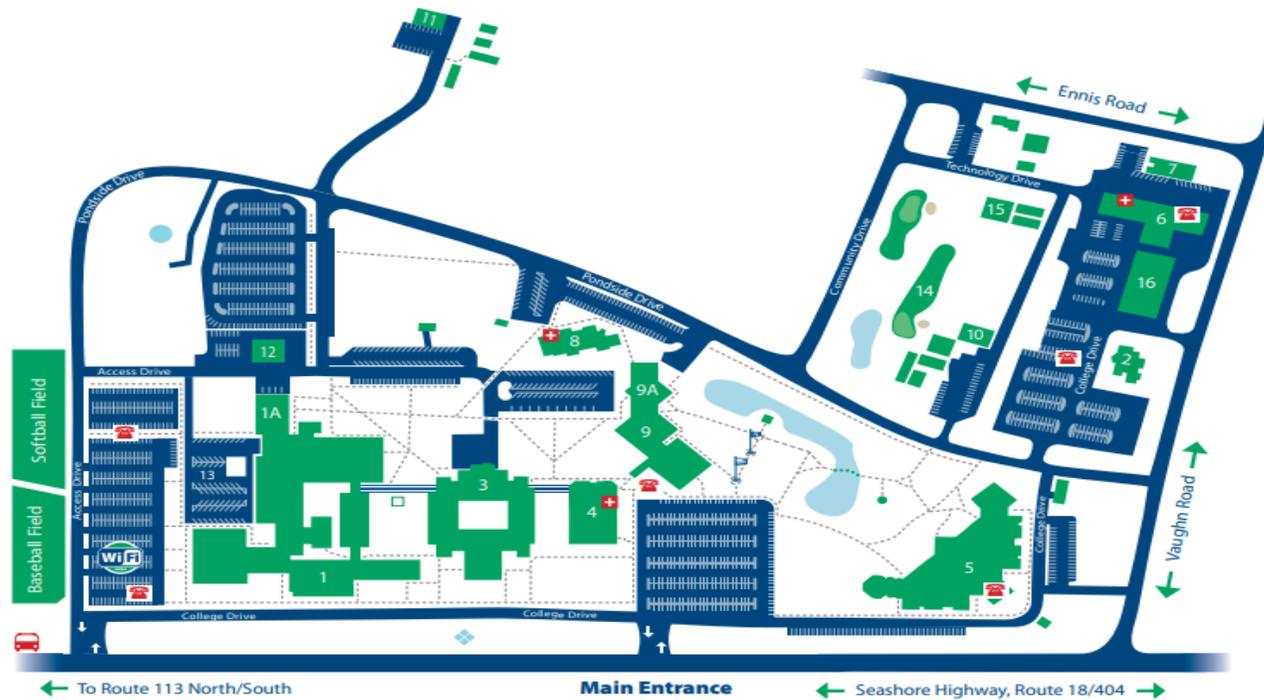

## Level 4 & 5 Grades

- No progress reports
  - a mid-term grade report is generated in D2L and sent to the student's DTCC email, but these are not sent to parents from the AC office
- Only semester grades are issued
- Numerical Grades are sent to counselors at home schools and appear on high school transcript
- Students can access grades on D2L for courses
- Students can access their full DTCC transcript in MyDTCC under the Student Information Tab any time

# Delaware Tech Grade Scales

\*Numerical grades are sent by the AC office to the Home Schools, so a grade between 60-69 translates as a “D” in school districts with the 10-point scale. On the DTCC transcript, a grade below 70 is recorded as an “F.”

## Best Advice for College Success?

# *GO TO CLASS!!!*

- You are getting COLLEGE CREDIT for your classes
- You must go to class . . . every time
- If you cannot attend class, please notify your instructor
- In case of delays or campus closures, you will receive alerts from DTCC at the phone numbers or email addresses that you have been getting alerts for the last several years. You can update this information in MYDTCC under the “Delaware Tech Alerts” tab. If classes are not canceled on a questionable weather day, **parents make the call on driving to Del Tech—Safety First**. Students will have an excused absence.



## If you decide to drop . . .

- Please contact me right away if you think you want to drop a course that you are enrolled in—DON'T JUST STOP GOING TO CLASS!!!!
- Fill out a Withdrawal form and submit it through your counselor at your home school, who will send it to the Academic Challenge office.
- The drop dates to withdraw so that the course does not appear on your DTCC transcript are Friday, September 4, for Fall 2026, and Friday, January 22, for Spring 2027
- If you withdraw after the withdrawal date up to three weeks before the end of the semester, you will receive a W on your transcript; a withdrawal within three weeks of the last day of class will appear as an F



# The Big Question:

## Do all Colleges take Dual Enrollment Credit?

- Ivy League schools and some highly selective institutions do not take Dual Enrollment Credit— Google the name of the school + "dual enrollment" and/or "transfer" credit for school policies
- Colleges and Universities may limit the number of transfer credits based on many factors:
  - The major you plan to pursue
  - The system of credits that college uses
  - If there is a course equivalent in the school's catalog
  - Sometimes students test out of required courses, but the school does not grant transfer credit

# Graduates Surveyed

AC sent a survey to 170 email addresses of AC graduates from the classes of **2015, 2016, 2017 & 2018**.

93 students responded. Here's what they said:

- ❖ 5 students said they didn't attempt to get their credits transferred
- ❖ 5 said their ivy league school didn't accept transfer credit
- ❖ 83 students said their schools accepted their transfer credit. 30 of these students attend UD, so all credit transferred
- ❖ 38 of the remaining 53 students took AC English. Of those students:
  - ✓ 23 students reported 4/4 English courses transferred – 61%
  - ✓ 9 students reported 3/4 English courses transferred – 24%
  - ✓ 3 students reported 2/4 English courses transferred – 8%
  - ✓ 3 students reported 1/4 English courses transferred – 8%
- ❖ 36 of the remaining 53 students took AC Math. Of those students:
  - ✓ 22 students reported 4/4 Math courses transferred – 61%
  - ✓ 7 reported that 3/4 Math courses transferred – 19%
  - ✓ 3 reported that 2/4 Math courses transferred – 8%
  - ✓ 4 reported that 1/4 Math courses transferred – 11%

AC sent a survey to 215 AC graduates from the classes of **2019, 2020, 2021 & 2022**.

89 students responded. Here's what they said:

- ❖ 8 students said they did not receive any transfer credit due to the school's policies
- ❖ 81 students said their schools accepted their transfer credit. 32 of these students attend DTCC or UD, so all credit transferred
- ❖ 38 of the remaining 49 students took AC English. Of those students:
  - ✓ 23 students reported 4/4 English courses transferred – 61%
  - ✓ 7 students reported 3/4 English courses transferred – 18%
  - ✓ 2 students reported 2/4 English courses transferred – 8%
  - ✓ 6 students reported 1/4 English courses transferred – 16%
- ❖ 27 of the remaining 49 students took AC Math. Of those students:
  - ✓ 17 students reported 4/4 Math courses transferred – 63%
  - ✓ 6 reported that 3/4 Math courses transferred – 22%
  - ✓ 2 reported that 2/4 Math courses transferred – 7%
  - ✓ 2 reported that 1/4 Math courses transferred – 7%

## If credits don't transfer are AC courses still helpful?

“Yes!! My AC classes prepared me for my courses, much more than I think AP courses at my home school would have. I was able to get out of the first two levels of calculus and go right into multivariable calculus, which I had taken with AC, so I had seen that subject before college which was super helpful...”

Having experience with writing research papers has been huge in my humanities/writing courses! Additionally, the once-a-week meeting time and heavy workload helped me develop the time management skills that are currently helping me be successful in my classes. Overall, my preparation from Academic Challenge really helped me transition in my first semester.”

# Why stick it out?

- Taking a college course on a college campus with a college instructor is the best preparation for college
- Rigor of AC course load distinguishes the student transcript from other top students in the competitive admissions process
- Transferability of credits can provide many advantages:
  - Early graduation
  - Lighter course load throughout 4 years of college
  - Allows room in schedule to pursue minors
  - Early registration for classes or housing

# “Path to College” Presentation

- AC & Sussex Tech 2016 and University of Pennsylvania 2020 graduate Zack Varrato delivered a webinar on how to approach the college search to AC students in September 2020, and again in September 2022
- His presentation gives step-by-step directions on how to
  - Keep track of your high school activities and accomplishments and create a resume
  - Approach test taking
  - Search for colleges that fit your academic goals, personal interests, and family finances
